I. Introduction

- The context in which the external evaluation report was drafted (the type of evaluation, the period covered by the evaluation, membership of the external quality experts' panel, etc.);

This External Evaluation Report (EER) was prepared at the request of the "Alexandru Ioan Cuza" University of Iași (UAIC), Faculty of Physical Education and Sport, in the context of the procedure for maintaining the accreditation of the doctoral university study field in Sports and Physical Education Science. The external evaluation visit of the aforementioned field took place between June 22-23th, 2026, with the physical participation of the members of the evaluation committee.

The Internal Evaluation Report (REI) for the field of doctoral studies in Sport Science and Physical Education was accomplished by Prof. PhD. Cojocariu Adrian, with the support of Prof. PhD Beatrice-Aurelia ABALAȘEI and Prof. PhD Bogdan-Constantin UNGUREAN.

The methodology for developing the internal evaluation report included the following steps:

- Collecting data regarding the activity of the doctoral study program: curricula, material and human resources, research infrastructure, performance indicators;
- Systematic analysis and interpretation of data according to ARACIS standards and the requirements of the educational legislative framework in force;
- Consulting stakeholders – academic staff, doctoral students, graduates, employer representatives – in order to identify strengths and areas for improvement;
- Preliminary drafting of the report, highlighting the progress made, the challenges identified, and the proposed improvement measures;
- Validation and approval of the report within the Council of the Doctoral School of Sports and Physical Education Science, Council of University Doctoral Studies (CUDS), and CEAC.

The self-evaluation process was carried out through active consultation and involvement of all stakeholders in the development of the doctoral study program: teaching staff, employer representatives, graduates and members of the Quality Assurance.

- Description of the higher education institution / Romanian Academy (establishment, evolution, mission, governance, structure, study programs/domains, external quality evaluation procedures applied);

Founded on October 26, 1860, **Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iași (UAIC)** has 15 faculties, 14 doctoral schools. Through its focus on research excellence, innovative teaching, and academic development, UAIC is consistently ranked among Romania's leading universities.

UAIC's doctoral studies are organized through IOSUD-UAIC, coordinated by the Council for University Doctoral Studies (CSUD), and include 14 doctoral schools. Doctoral programs are offered in 30 fields spanning the natural sciences, social sciences, humanities, economics, law, theology, education, and sport sciences.

UAIC's academic activity is based on the integration of education and research, aligned with national and international developments in higher education. Doctoral studies are governed by the Higher Education Law no. 199/2023, OME no. 3020/2024, the Institutional Regulation on Doctoral Studies, and the University Charter.

UAIC was institutionally evaluated by ARACIS in 2009, 2015, and 2022, receiving the qualification **High Degree of Trust** each time. In 2021, IOSUD-UAIC and its doctoral fields underwent external evaluation, resulting in the maintenance of accreditation for IOSUD and most doctoral fields. The fields of Theology and Communication Sciences initially received conditional accreditation but subsequently regained full accreditation following re-evaluation in 2023 and 2024, respectively.

Additional ARACIS decisions accredited the doctoral fields of Administrative Sciences (2023), Business Administration (2023), and Social Work (2025). Order no. 5838/2021 confirming UAIC's accreditation to organize doctoral studies was published in the Official Gazette no. 55/19.01.2022.

The Doctoral School of Sport and Physical Education Science (DSSPES) was established by UAIC [UAIC Senate Decision no. 14 of 14.02.2019](#). Its mission is to provide high-quality doctoral training through advanced study programs, effective supervision and mentoring, rigorous evaluation standards, and strong connections with research institutions and socio-economic partners.

- General description of the doctoral study domain (why it was established - in the case of a provisional authorisation to operate; evolution and/or changes since the last external quality evaluation procedure - in the case of procedures intended for accreditation or maintaining accreditation, as applicable).

Doctoral studies within DSSPES are conducted in accordance with the Institutional Regulation on Doctoral University Studies, the Higher Education Law no. 199/2023, OME no. 3020/2024, the UAIC Charter, and [the DSSPES Regulation on Organization and Functioning](#), all approved by the University Senate.

DSSPES operates as a distinct structure within the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport, with its own governance and regulations. The [Doctoral School Council](#) is chaired by Prof. Dr. Adrian Cojocariu and includes representatives of UAIC, an international academic member, and a doctoral student representative.

Currently, DSSPES organizes doctoral studies in the field of Sport Science and Physical Education, established by MEN Order no. 3100/28.01.2019. Following the periodic external evaluation, the field received the qualification Maintenance of Accreditation through ME Order no. 5838/2021.

Compared to the 2021 external evaluation, the Doctoral Study Field of Sport Science and Physical Education has expanded with three additional tenured doctoral supervisors, Prof. PhD. Bogdan-Constantin Ungurean, Assoc. Prof. PhD. Cezar Honceriu and Assoc. Prof. PhD. Marius Neculăș. To support internationalization, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Antonio Tessitore (Università degli Studi di Roma "Foro Italico", Italy) joined the Doctoral School Council. Additionally, in compliance with current legislation, each Advisory and Academic Integrity Committee includes one external member from outside UAIC.

II. Methods used

- Analyzed documents (internal evaluation report and its annexes; additional documents requested before and during the on-site visit, if any; other documents or data);

Prior to the site visit, the Self-Evaluation Report (REI) of the „Alexandru Ioan Cuza” University (UAIC), together with its annexes and supporting documents, was reviewed. The evaluation team also examined the websites of UAIC’s doctoral schools. The visit conducted on June 22–23th 2026 provided additional insights into the doctoral field of Sport and Physical Education Science.

The evaluation was based on the self-evaluation report, annexes, official documents available on the university website, and supplementary documents requested before and during the visit. Meetings held according to the evaluation schedule addressed key aspects of the doctoral program, including institutional and faculty development strategies, doctoral supervisors’ involvement, doctoral students’ feedback, implementation of quality assurance procedures and regulations, the activity of the ethics committee, and the operation of research laboratories.

The on-site visit began with a preliminary meeting of the evaluation team to coordinate and harmonize the evaluation process. During the visit, the experts participated in a series of meetings with representatives of UAIC, the Sport Science and Physical Education doctoral field, academic staff, the director of the doctoral school, employers, and representatives of the quality assurance and ethics structures. These discussions provided valuable information and supported the completion of the evaluation report.

III. Judgment on the extent to which the standards and performance indicators are fulfilled

DOMAIN A. Institutional capacity

Criterion A.1. Managerial and administrative structures and processes involving students and other stakeholders

Standard S.A.1.1. Organizational components and institutional processes

The HEI has organizational components in its structure, which function based on adequate competencies, responsibilities, processes, and implementation procedures, and ensure an effective management system.

Indicator

For delivering the study program/domain, the HEI has adequate organizational components and an adequate management system, which operates based on methodologies, regulations and procedures that are periodically reviewed as required by law.

Compared with the previous evaluation period, the Doctoral School of Sport and Physical Education Science continues to operate under the national legal framework and its own approved [regulations](#). Organized as a distinct department within the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport, it is managed by the [Doctoral School Council](#), which includes academic staff from UAIC and an international member, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Antonio Tessitore (Università degli Studi di Roma "Foro Italico", Italy). The school provides doctoral studies in the field of Sport and Physical Education Science, a field accredited in 2019 and whose accreditation was maintained following the 2021 external evaluation.

The analysis demonstrates strong compliance with the national regulatory framework, a clearly defined governance structure, and a commitment to internationalization through the inclusion of an international member in the Doctoral School Council. It also confirms the continued accreditation of the doctoral field.

However, the description is largely formal and procedural, providing limited evidence of the actual effectiveness of governance, doctoral student participation, quality assurance mechanisms, and the tangible impact of internationalization initiatives. Additional information on research performance, doctoral outcomes, and the functioning of the School's management structures would strengthen the evidence base for evaluation.

The HEI proves that it engages the relevant stakeholders in developing methodologies and regulations, as well as implementation procedures.

The academic community is actively involved in the drafting, revision, endorsement, and approval of university regulations and methodologies, including [The University Code of Students' Rights and Obligations](#). According to the [Procedure for the Development of Documented Information and the Procedure for Drafting Procedures](#), all documented information follows a structured approval process involving relevant stakeholders and university governing bodies. To ensure transparency, the university publishes information of interest on www.uaic.ro. Within the Doctoral School of Sport Science and Physical Education, members contribute to the periodic revision of regulations and the PPUA, the affiliation of new doctoral supervisors, the establishment of supervision and academic integrity committees, and the capitalization of research results.

The UAIC academic community is actively involved in the development, endorsement, and approval of normative documents through transparent and participatory procedures. Within the Doctoral School of Sport Science and Physical Education, members contribute to the revision of regulations and the PPUA, while actively participating in academic governance and decision-making processes.

The HEI legally owns venues for the related education, research and administrative processes, as well as for services for students, doctoral students and trainees, thus providing an enabling environment for living and studying, including for disabled persons. Optimal venues are also provided for activities of the staff. Such venues are adequately equipped.

[The spaces and material resources of the Doctoral School](#) support the conduct of research activities in accordance with its mission and objectives. Located in Building D of UAIC, the Doctoral School provides doctoral students with equipped study rooms, access to computers, specialized software, laboratory equipment, library facilities, and international databases. It also hosts academic activities such as courses, workshops, conferences, and doctoral thesis defenses, while ensuring improved accessibility for persons with disabilities and access to both a mini-library and the faculty library.

Since the last periodic evaluation (2021), the Doctoral School Laboratory (*Anexa 1. Infintare si procedura acces laborator SD*) was established in 2023, providing doctoral students with access to newly acquired [high-performance equipments](#) for both laboratory and field research. [The Library of Psycho-Pedagogy, Physical Education, and Sport](#) supports the educational and research activities of the Doctoral School through its specialized collections. Additionally, the academic community benefits from access to international scientific resources through [ANELIS PLUS](#) (2020 – National Electronic Access to Scientific Literature for Supporting the Research and Education System in Romania).

The Doctoral School of Sport and Physical Education Science provides adequate facilities and resources to support research activities. Doctoral students benefit from study spaces, research infrastructure, library resources, access to international databases, and facilities that ensure accessibility for persons with disabilities.

The organizational components manage the movable and immovable assets used for the evaluated study program/domain in an optimal, sustainable manner.

The movable and immovable assets are properly maintained to ensure optimal conditions for studying, living and research, as well as for work.

An access procedure for the use and maintenance of assets was approved following the CSD meeting of 25.09.2023 (item 6- *Anexa 1. Infintare si procedura acces laborator SD*), regulating the use of equipment in the doctoral school's research laboratory. Software licenses associated with laboratory equipment are functional and updated periodically. Within IOSUD-UAIC, the maintenance of immovable assets is ensured by the [Technical Directorate](#), which has qualified staff in economic, administrative, and technical fields.

The use of equipment in the doctoral laboratory is governed by a CSD-approved procedure, while software licenses remain operational and are updated on a regular basis. The maintenance of fixed assets is ensured at institutional level through the specialized technical structures of IOSUD-UAIC.

The HEI has the required human resources to organize and deliver the evaluated study program/domain.

The teaching staff has the required qualifications and professional competences to teach the subject matters assigned to them in the job list.

Within the doctoral field of Sport and Physical Education Science, six doctoral supervisors are active, all tenured staff members of IOSUD-UAIC with permanent contracts, five of whom meet the current CNATDCU minimum standards. Since the submission of the internal evaluation report, [Associate Professor Dr. Marius Neculaes](#) has become affiliated with the doctoral school (AS1, AS2).

All supervisors have at least five Web of Science-indexed publications and are members of scientific committees of international conferences and specialized journals. Professional involvement includes roles such as Prof. Dr. Adrian Cococariu serving as [Vice-President of the Coaches' College](#), and other positions within national sports federations. [The four teaching staff members](#) involved in [the Advanced University Training Program \(PPUA\)](#) demonstrate solid expertise in the disciplines they teach.

The doctoral field of Sport and Physical Education Science includes five doctoral supervisors, all tenured members of IOSUD-UAIC with consistent scientific output and international visibility, four of whom comply with current CNATDCU standards. The teaching staff involved in the PPUA demonstrate solid and recognized academic expertise in their respective disciplines.

UAIC shows continuous support for the professional and personal development of its staff by financially encouraging ISI-indexed publications, participation in Erasmus+ mobility programs, and attendance at international conferences. During the evaluated period, these measures have contributed to an increased level of scientific activity among doctoral supervisors (*Anexa 4. Fise CNATDCU 2021-2025, AS2*).

UAIC promotes the professional development of academic staff by providing financial support for ISI-indexed publications, Erasmus+ mobility, and participation in international conferences, thereby enhancing scientific productivity and international visibility.

UAIC has implemented the [eSims](#) system for managing student records and academic pathways, developed under a project funded by the Ministry of Education and [continuously improved](#) by the Digital Communications and IT Directorate. Additionally, through the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR) (2022–2025), UAIC is implementing the project “[Framework for the sustainable development of the university's digital component – eUAIC](#),” which includes the development of a Portal and a Student Management application aimed at improving digital academic management and increasing efficiency.

UAIC uses an integrated IT system (eSims) for managing student records and academic progress, which is continuously developed and updated to meet institutional requirements. Between 2022 and 2025, through the PNRR, the university is implementing the eUAIC project aimed at expanding and modernizing digital tools for the management of academic records and activities.

The study program is based on a curriculum designed so that students can acquire the expected learning outcomes.

It includes all learning, teaching, practical training, research and evaluation experiences, which, together, lead to a higher education qualification.

The doctoral study program provides a total of 240 ECTS credits and, according to [the Doctoral School Regulations](#)– Article 15, includes the Advanced University Studies Program (PPUA) and the Scientific Research

* The term "programmes" concerns the external quality evaluation for the study programs contained in a master's/doctoral domain. The term "programme" shall be used hereafter.

Program (PCS). The structure and content of the PPUA are defined in *Annex no. 2* and are included in the annually approved study plan.

The PPUA comprises mandatory and optional courses, including Ethics and Academic Integrity, and ensures the acquisition of 30 ECTS credits. Mandatory courses cover key areas such as applied psychomotricity, optimization of biological potential, research methodology and statistics, while optional courses address body aesthetics and kinetotherapy. The first four courses cover content relevant to research methodology and data statistics, as reflected [the course syllabi](#). [The study plan](#) defines learning outcomes in accordance with ARACIS standards.

The doctoral program in Sport and Physical Education Science totals 240 ECTS credits and is structured into the PPUA (30 ECTS) and the Scientific Research Program (PCS). The PPUA includes both mandatory and optional courses, among which Ethics and Academic Integrity is included, with course content aligned to research methodology requirements and ARACIS standards. Doctoral students are assessed by course instructors upon completion of the PPUA, and the study plan is approved on an annual basis.

Through [course content and teaching strategies](#) aligned with doctoral students' training needs, the organizational component ensures compliance with student-centered learning principles. Throughout the doctoral program, students also receive continuous guidance through written feedback and direct meetings with supervisory and academic integrity committees (*Anexa 5. Comisii de indrumare an univ 2025-2026*).

The course structure and teaching strategies are aligned with student-centered learning principles, while doctoral students benefit from ongoing guidance and feedback provided by the supervisory and academic integrity committees.

As part of its internationalization strategy, "Alexandru Ioan Cuza" University of Iași has concluded [845 agreements](#) with universities across Europe and has developed [68 inter-institutional collaboration agreements](#) since 2015. These partnerships, together with existing [mobility agreements](#), enable doctoral supervisors and students within IOSUD-UAIC to participate in teaching, study, and practice mobilities. Specifically, the Doctoral School in Sport and Physical Education Science benefits from mobility agreements with foreign universities, supporting the development of doctoral students' professional and research competencies and strengthening the international dimension of doctoral studies.

UAIC implements an extensive internationalization strategy, including over 800 agreements with universities in 31 countries. Within this framework, the Doctoral School in Sport and Physical Education Science maintains mobility agreements with 60 universities, providing doctoral students with opportunities for teaching, study, and international research activities.

The most recent institutional evaluation of UAIC was conducted in 2022 ([ARACIS Report following the evaluation](#)), while the last external quality evaluation of the doctoral study program in Sport Science and Physical Education took place in 2021, resulting in Official Order 5,838/2021 regarding the maintenance of accreditation, published in Official Gazette 55/19.01.2022. The doctoral study program also underwent an intermediate external evaluation in November 2024.
